Namekagon River Cleanup Saturday, April 28th

Join the Namekagon River Partnership for our first annual spring river cleanup event.

We are gathering at the Hayward Landing (on Highway 27 near the DNR Ranger Station) at 9am on April 28th. The National Park Service is co-hosting this cleanup event with us.

We are looking for volunteers to help with logistics as well as the actual cleanup. You may be able to help us by driving cleanup volunteers to and from the work sites.

The river cleanup will focus on three Namekagon River sections: Hayward Landing to Stinnett Landing, Stinnett Landing to Springbrook Landing, and Springbrook Landing to Trego (Visitor Center) Landing.

Here's what **we** are bringing to the cleanup:

- A least one drift boat per section (thank you Hayward Fly Fishing Company)
- Gloves, bags, spears, can grabbers, and maps.
- Multiple canoes

Here's what we are asking **you** to bring (remember the water will be chilly):

- A personal flotation device (PFD). Participants are **REQUIRED** to wear PFDs while being on/in the water. Children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
- Bag lunch and water.
- Sunscreen is recommended to prevent sunburns.
- Waders and/or trapper's gloves if you have them.
- Canoe if you have one.

Here's the plan:

- Meet at Hayward Landing (on Highway 27 near the DNR Ranger Station) at 9am.
- Sign the volunteer forms and divide up into three work groups.
- Cleanup the respective sections of the river
- End of day gathering at the National Park Service Visitor Center in Trego
